WHEREAS, In Ordinance 51-2021 this Council approved the 2021 salaries for the Garfield Heights Police Department, and

WHEREAS, at this time, the City wishes to amend the Garfield Heights Police Department Organizational structure to include the following changes: 1) there shall be no more than two (2) Police Captains; and 2) there shall be no more than forty (40) Patrolmen.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Garfield Heights, Ohio, that:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 51-2021 shall be amended to read as follows (language being removed shall be indicated by struckthrough; language being added shall be indicated in **bold**):

Paragraph 1.

- (A) There shall be one (1) Chief of the Police Department who shall receive the sum of One Hundred Nineteen Thousand, Three Hundred, and Ninety-Five dollars (\$119,395.00) per annum and payable every two (2) weeks.
- (B) There shall be **no more than** one (1) two (2) Captains of the Police Department who shall receive the sum of One Hundred and Three Thousand, Seven Hundred and Thirty-Two Dollars (\$103,732.00) per annum, payable every two (2) weeks.
- (C) There shall be no more than <u>seven (7) Lieutenants of the Police Department</u> who shall each receive the sum of Ninety-two Thousand, Eight Hundred and Ninety-two Dollars (\$92,892.00) per annum, payable every two (2) weeks.
- (C) There shall be no more than <u>five (5) Sergeants of the Police Department</u> who shall each receive the sum of Eighty-Two Thousand, Seven Hundred, Thirty-Five Dollars (\$82,735.00) per annum, payable every two (2) weeks.
- (D) There shall be no more than thirty eight (38) forty (40) Patrolmen of the Police Department whose salaries shall be as follows:
- (1) <u>First Class Patrolmen</u> with two (2) years or more of service shall each receive the sum of Seventy-Two Thousand, Four Hundred and Forty-Three Dollars (\$72,443.00) per annum, payable every two (2) weeks.
- (2) <u>Second Class Patrolmen</u> with more than one (1) year but less than two (2) years of service shall each receive the sum of Sixty-Two Thousand, Six Hundred, Thirty-Five Dollars (\$62,635.00) per annum, payable every two (2) weeks.

- (3) <u>Third Class Patrolmen</u> with one year or less of service shall each receive the sum of Fifty-Five Thousand, Four Hundred and Zero Dollars (\$55,400.00) per annum, payable every two (2) weeks.
- SECTION 2. Those provisions contained in Ordinance No. 51-2021 are inconsistent with the provisions in this Ordinance, are hereby repealed from and after the effective date of this Ordinance.
- SECTION 3. The Finance Director is hereby authorized and directed to issue her vouchers of the City for the purpose set forth in Section 1. hereof, said vouchers to be charged to the appropriate fund.
- SECTION 4.
